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I. INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Plenipotentiary Conference Decision No. 04/PAPU/PC/X/2021, the Policy and Regulation Committee (PRC) held its meeting on 3rd and 4th June 2024 at the PAPU Tower in Arusha. The deliberations were presided over by the PRC Chairperson, the Republic of Kenya, represented by Mr. Matano Ndaro. In attendance were the following Member States: Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Democratic Republic of Congo, Egypt, Kenya, Malawi, Mali, Mozambique, Namibia, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe. EACO attended the proceedings in an observer capacity.

The detailed attendance list is attached as **Annex 2**.

II. OPENING REMARKS

The PAPU Secretary General and the PRC Chairperson took turns to present their opening remarks.

1. By the PRC Chairperson

In his introductory remarks, the Chairman welcomed all participants and extended his profound gratitude to the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania for the gracious hospitality and seamless organization of this 42nd Ordinary Session of the PAPU Administrative Council.

He proceeded to thank and commend the PAPU General Secretariat for the high standards of the working documents and their timely circulation to Committee members.

Turning to the Policy and Regulation Committee, the Chairman reiterated its role and highlighted its pre-eminent impact on the smooth functioning of the Union. He equally conveyed his hearty appreciation to the PRC Working Groups for the tremendous groundwork undertaken in preparation for the Committee's proceedings.

Lastly, he pointed out that the PRC's agenda during this meeting is of vital importance, calling on members to actively participate in the deliberations in order to enhance the ensuing documentation and proposals.

2. By the PAPU Secretary General

Dr. Sifundo Chief Moyo, PAPU Secretary General, began by expressing his heartfelt appreciation to the Committee members for their presence at the PAPU Headquarters to attend this 42nd Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council.

He noted that this presence was a clear manifestation of their keen interest in advancing the Union's broad agenda.

He went on to restate the Committee's core mandate, which is to chart a roadmap and lay down guidelines for postal reform by setting standards, harmonizing policy and regulatory frameworks, and addressing all issues related to the Acts of the Union.

The PAPU Secretary General also announced to Committee members that Mr. Philippe Arnaud SAWADOGO, a citizen of Burkina Faso, had been recruited as Head of Department for Policy, Regulation and Legal Affairs of the Union in January 2024 to further enhance the human resource capacity at the Secretariat, the Working Groups, and the Policy and Regulation Committee. He noted that all these measures will go a long way towards facilitating the fulfilment of their respective mandates.

Lastly, he once again pledged the General Secretariat's full support for the Policy and Regulation Committee, stressing that for the Administrative Council to successfully tackle policy and regulation matters, it relied heavily on the outcomes of the Committee's activities.

III. THE PRC BUREAU MEMBERSHIP

The PRC's Bureau is currently composed as follows:

IV. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

The draft agenda was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 01. It was adopted with no amendment. The adopted agenda is attached as **Annex 3**.

V. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE DELIBERATIONS

The PRC's deliberations were centered on **ten (10)** substantive items, contained in **twelve (12)** working documents. The salient matters presented for consideration during this session were as follows:

- Presentation of the Policy and Legal Harmonization Working Group's Report;
- Presentation of the Regulation Development Working Group's Report;
- Implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations taken by the Administrative Council on postal policy and regulation matters during its 41st Ordinary Session;
- Implementation status of the Policy and Regulation Committee Work Plan;
- Proposed amendments to the Acts of the Union;
- Handover/takeover procedure between incoming and outgoing officials;
- Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum;
- African Postal Regulators Conference.

VI. SYNOPSIS OF PROCEEDINGS

The PRC conducted its proceedings in line with the adopted agenda. Comprehensive reports of the various Working Group meetings together with the related annexes were tabled for consideration by participants.

1. Presentation of Policy and Legal Harmonization Working Group Report

Representing the Republic of Zimbabwe in the capacity of Chairperson of the Working Group, Mr. Kennedy Dewera, expressed appreciation to the United Republic of Tanzania for the well-organized 42nd Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council and complimented the General Secretariat on the high-quality working documents before proceeding to present the Working Group's report.

This report was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 02 and Annexes. The Policy and Legal Harmonization Working Group's Report is attached as **Annex 4**. The presentation of the Working Group's report was followed by a detailed presentation of the accompanying annexes by the General Secretariat.

From the presentations, the following conclusions were drawn:

a) On implementation status of the Working Group's Work Plan

The Implementation Status of the Working Group's Work Plan was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 02a and Annex.

More specifically, the Policy and Legal Harmonization Working Group's Work Plan is structured into **nine (09)** deliverables and **twenty-five (25)** activities, **fifteen (15)** of which have been completed, while **ten (10)** are in progress.

The following activities are in progress:

- Adoption of the African Postal Guidelines by the African Union Commission, which is still
 pending despite several reminders by the PAPU General Secretariat;
- Provision by Member States and Restricted Unions of postal regulation documents and models, as requested in 2023 by the PAPU General Secretariat. So far, only CRASA and SAPOA have shared their postal regulation documents and models.

However, to make up for the lack of response from Member States with respect to the expected documents, the General Secretariat has prepared and circulated a questionnaire on postal regulation in Africa to Member States. The Implementation Status of the Working Group's Work Plan is attached as **Annex 5**.

Following presentation of the report and annexes, the PRC members adopted the Working Group's document and recommendations, before calling on:

- Member States to respond to the questionnaire on postal regulation in order to improve the response rate, thereby enabling the General Secretariat to build up a representative database on postal regulation. In this respect, Member States were requested to contact the General Secretariat to ensure that their completed questionnaires had been sent to the rightful recipient and, if necessary, resend the questionnaire to the appropriate recipient;
- In its interactions with Member States, the General Secretariat prioritizes official communication channels. As an additional channel, WhatsApp groups could be used.

Another aspect raised by the PRC members was the large number of activities scheduled in the activity programmes of the Working Groups. The proposal for the next cycle was therefore to retain the most salient and realistic deliverables and activities with regard to the challenges facing the Union and the African postal sector.

b) On implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations from the 41st Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council

This was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 02b and Annex.

Participants were updated on the implementation status of **two (02)** Resolutions and **three (03)** Recommendations adopted by the Administrative Council during its 41st Ordinary Session held from 29th to 30th August 2023 in Arusha, United Republic of Tanzania.

With the exception of the activity "Table a resolution amending the Acts of the Union during the next Plenipotentiary Conference", for which it was pointed out that the deadline had not yet expired, all the Resolutions and Recommendations had been implemented.

The implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations from the 41st Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council is attached as **Annex 6**.

Following the presentation, the PRC concluded that the activity "Table a resolution amending the Acts of the Union during the next Plenipotentiary Conference" under Resolution No. 05/PAPU/AC/XLI/2023 had been completed. This is on the grounds that implementation of this activity no longer fell under the purview of both the PRC and the Administrative Council.

The PRC noted the implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations from the 41st Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council and adopted the accompanying recommendations.

c) On proposed amendments to the Acts of the Union

The proposed amendments to the Acts of the Union were presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024- Doc No. 02c and Annex. Five (05) proposed amendments, including one (01) to the Convention, three (03) to the Detailed Regulations of the Convention and one (01) to the Rules of Procedure of the Plenipotentiary Conference, were tabled to the PRC for consideration and adoption. These include:

- Emergency consultation of the Plenipotentiary Conference (Article 11.2 of the Detailed Regulations of the PAPU Convention);
- Introduction of a new provision on cybersecurity and the personal data protection (Article 20 of the PAPU Convention);
- Redefinition of the term vacant seat (Article 6.1 of the Detailed Regulations of the PAPU Convention);

- Clarifying the procedure for filling vacant seats on the Administrative Council (Article 6.2 of the Detailed Regulations of the PAPU Convention);
- Procedure and method for consultation of Member States of the Conference Bureau (Article 5(bis) of the Rules of Procedure of the Plenipotentiary Conference).

The proposed amendments to the Convention are attached as **Annex 7**.

Following the presentation, the PRC members opted to highlight the involvement of postal sector players by reframing the provisions of **Article 20 (New)** of the PAPU Convention on cybersecurity and personal data protection, as follows: "**Member States**, **particularly postal sector players**...".

Furthermore, the meeting participants clarified the provisions of **Article 5 (bis)** of the Rules of Procedure f the Plenipotentiary Conference on emergency consultation of the Conference Bureau by adding the reference "Member States of the Conference Bureau" to the sentence "Insofar as possible, consultation shall take place by the most effective methods and means in light of the nature and urgency of the matter referred for consultation."

The proposed amendments were adopted by the PRC.

d) On handover/takeover procedure between incoming and outgoing officials

This was presented as Document No. **PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 02d.** In order to facilitate a thorough understanding of how the Secretariat is organized and operates, as well as to ensure service continuity at the General Secretariat via a more effective handover/takeover of the full portfolio of the General Secretariat's mandate, a ten (10) article procedure for handover/takeover between incoming and outgoing elected officials has been proposed. The salient provisions of this instrument are as follows:

- Incoming elected officials shall assume duty at the PAPU Headquarters two (02) weeks ahead of the scheduled date of the official handover/takeover ceremony;
- The Union shall to cater to lodging and board as well as transportation for the incoming elected officials during the two (02) week period.

The handover/takeover procedure between incoming and outgoing elected officials is attached as **Annex 8**.

Following the presentation, the members of the Political and Regulatory Committee recommended reducing the period from two (2) weeks to one (01) week, specifically in order to minimize the financial implications of the handover/takeover procedure between incoming and outgoing elected officials.

Upon consideration of the draft handover/takeover procedure, the PRC authorized the General Secretariat to forward the document to the Finance and Administration Committee for consideration.

2. Presentation of the Regulation Development Working Group Report

Representing the Republic of Côte d'Ivoire in the capacity of Chairperson of the Working Group, Ms. Massiratché Fofana began by extending her appreciation to the United Republic of Tanzania for the well-organized 42nd Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council and complimented the PAPU General Secretariat on the high-quality working documents availed to participants before going ahead to present the Working Group's report.

Document No. PAPU/ATC/PRC/04/2024 - Doc No.03 and its Annexes were presented to PRC members. The full report of the Regulation Development Working Group is attached as **Annex 9**.

The presentation of the Working Group's report was followed by a detailed review of the annexes to the report made by the General Secretariat.

From the presentations, the following conclusions were drawn:

a) On the development of postal regulation documents and models

The report on this matter was presented as document **No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 03a.** PRC members were informed that the 1st edition of the African Postal Regulators Conference, held in Dakar in 2023, had established **four (4)** thematic teams made up of PAPU Member States and CRASA.

These thematic teams are tasked with analyzing the following documents proposed by the General Secretariat:

- ✓ Regulatory cooperation framework;
- ✓ Legal and policy framework;
- ✓ Capacity-building mechanism for postal regulation officers;
- ✓ Regulatory framework for postal financial activities.

However, the General Secretariat had been unable to produce these materials because the documents and models it had requested were still awaited, despite an appeal by the Administrative Council during its 41st Ordinary Session, followed by reminders from the General Secretariat.

Furthermore, considering the low participation of Member States in the thematic teams, the Committee Chairperson called for greater engagement. The following Member States and Subregional organizations heeded this call by expressing their interest in joining the thematic teams:

- Thematic Team n°1: Tanzania and Kenya;
- Thematic Team n°2: Uganda and EACO;
- Thematic Team n°3: Tanzania, Kenya and EACO;
- Thematic Team n°4: Tanzania and EACO.

Upon presentation of the report and annexes, PRC members instructed the General Secretariat to explore the possibility of engaging an external consultant to develop the policy and legal frameworks as well as the policy for regulating financial activities. The report is attached as **annex 10**

b) On implementation status of the Regulation Development Working Group's Work Plan

The Implementation Status of the Regulation Development Working Group's Work Plan was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 03b and Annex.

The Work Plan of the Working Group on Regulatory Development contains **ten (10)** deliverables and **thirty-one (31)** activities/tasks. The Work Plan implementation status shows that **nine (09)** activities have been completed while **twenty-two (22)** are in progress.

The activities in progress include adoption by the African Union Commission of the African Postal Guidelines. In this respect, it is worth noting that the Guidelines are still to be adopted by the African Union Commission. The implementation status of the Regulation Development Working Group's Work Plan is attached as **annex 11**.

c) On Implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations by the Administrative Council on regulation matters during its 41st Ordinary Session;

Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024 - Doc No.03c and its Annexes were presented to PRC members. This presentation pointed out that specifies that during its 41st Ordinary Session, the Administrative Council adopted **two (02)** resolutions and **one (01)** recommendation, all of which have been implemented.

However, PRC members requested that additional activities be added to the recommendation "Develop policy and legal frameworks for postal regulation", such as collecting and analyzing regulatory documents, as well as developing policy and legal frameworks for postal regulation.

The implementation status of Decisions, Resolutions and Recommendations by the Administrative Council on regulation matters is attached as **annex 12**.

d) On proposed theme for Postal Regulators Forum

The proposed theme for this event was presented as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024- Doc No. 03d. In the presentation on this item, the General Secretariat requested validation of the following theme for the 2024 edition of the Postal Regulators Forum: "Leveraging postal regulation to advance postal financial inclusion" In this regard, the proposal was to organize two (02) panel discussions on the following sub-themes:

- Sub-theme 1: Current state and prospects for promoting postal financial inclusion;
- Sub-theme 2: Key success factors for postal financial inclusion.

The following Member States responded favourably to the appeal by the Secretariat General and the PRC Chairperson to participate as panelists in the Postal Regulators Forum as follows:

- Panel 1: Mali and Uganda;
- Panel 2: Côte d'Ivoire, Malawi and Tanzania.

The document on proposed theme for Postal Regulators Forum is attached as **annex 13**.

e) On proposed Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum

The General Secretariat presented the Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum as Document No. PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/2024-Doc No. 03e.

It was reiterated that this document is a logical sequel to *Resolution No. 08/PAPU/AC/XLI/2023* adopting the Terms of Reference of the Postal CEOs Forum and the Postal Regulators Forum. Pursuant to this Resolution, the Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum is as follows:

- 01 Chairperson;
- 01 Vice-Chairperson;
- 02 Rapporteurs.

In line with the new Bureau structure of the Forum, the General Secretariat proposed the following Bureau Membership:

- Chairperson: Central Africa;
- Vice-Chair: North Africa;
- Rapporteurs: West and Southern Africa;
- Secretary: PAPU General Secretariat.

Following this presentation, the members of the Commission observed that East Africa was absent. In response, the General Secretariat pointed out that East Africa's absence was due to the limited number of seats on the Bureau, which could not accommodate all five PAPU subregions. It is worth noting, however, that East Africa chaired the outgoing bureau. Therefore, embracing an inclusive approach that incorporates all five sub-regions of the Union in the bureau membership, the Policy and Regulation Committee proposed a structure that accommodates all the sub-regions.

Furthermore, PRC members opted to introduce the concept of "Co-Chairs" and to bring before the Administrative Council a draft resolution amending the Terms of Reference of the Postal Regulators Forum with regard to the Bureau membership. Accordingly, the revised Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum is as follows:

- 02 Co-Chairs: Central and North Africa;
- 03 Rapporteurs: West, East and Southern Africa.

The document on proposed Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum is attached as annex 14.

f) On the 2nd Postal Regulators Conference

A Brief on the organization of this event was presented as Document No. **PAPU/AC/ATC/PRC/04/24- Doc No. 03f**. In this regard, the General Secretariat proposed the following core theme for the 2nd edition of the African Postal Regulators Conference: "*Emerging postal industry and regulation trends in the digital age.*"

Participants will be exploring this theme via the following sub-themes:

- Digitalizing traditional services for operators to facilitate access to products and create valueadded services for customers;
- Technical and legal challenges facing postal services digitalization;
- Postal regulation techniques and methods for efficient postal services digitalization;
- Capacity-building in new lines of expertise.

Before concluding this presentation, the General Secretariat and the PRC Chairperson appealed to Member States to facilitate the organization of the 2nd Postal Regulators Conference by either offering to host it or extending any necessary assistance to the General Secretariat in organizing the event, should it be held at the PAPU Headquarters in Arusha.

Following deliberations on this matter, PRC members requested the General Secretariat to notify Member States once a new date is set for this event following its postponement to a later date. This information should enable Member States to better assess their availability to host the event or offer the necessary assistance to the General Secretariat. The report is attached as **annex 15**

VII. DATE AND VENUE OF NEXT MEETING

The date and venue of the next meeting will be notified to PRC members subsequently following consultations between the General Secretariat and the Committee bureau.

VIII. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

No issue was raised under this item, be it by the General Secretariat or by Committee members.

IX. CLOSING

The PAPU Assistant Secretary General expressed her gratitude to the PRC members for their active participation and constructive contributions to the proceedings and thanked the staff of the General Secretariat for their commendable efforts in ensuring the success of these deliberations.

The PRC Chairperson began expressed his deep gratitude to the United Republic of Tanzania for the excellent organization. He went ahead to appreciate the he collegial spirit in which the discussions had taken place, before thanking the PRC members, the General Secretariat for the high-quality working documents and the interpreters for their excellent servicing of the proceedings. Lastly, he closed the PRC meeting at 1:15 (East Africa Time, i.e. GMT +3).

X. RECOMMENDATIONS

Following presentation of the Working Group reports and annexes, the Policy and Regulation Committee recommends that the Administrative Council:

- Recommends Member States to respond to the postal regulation questionnaire no later than two (02) weeks;
- For Member States that have not yet done so, requests them to establish postal regulatory authorities;
- Adopt the proposed changes to the Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum;
- Adopt the principle of tabling a draft resolution on proposed amendments to the Acts of the Union.

Persuaded that these proposals are germane and aim to remedy the deficiencies in the Acts of the Union;

Cognizant of the recommendation tabled by the Policy and Regulation Committee;

HEREBY APPROVES:

The principle of submitting a draft resolution amending the Acts of the Union to the 11th Ordinary Session of the Conference as expressed hereinabove;

Further mindful of the Detailed Regulations of the PAPU Convention;

Having regard to the Rules of Procedure of the Administrative Council;

Considering the PAPU Administrative Council's Resolution No. 18/PAPU/AC/XXXVI/2017 of 10th May 2017, establishing an annual African Postal Regulators Forum;

Mindful of PAPU Administrative Council's Resolution No. 06/PAPU/AC/XXXVIII/2019 of 19th June 2019, establishing an annual African Postal CEOs Forum;

Further considering Resolution No. 07/PAPU/AC/XLI/2023 of 30th August 2023adopting the Terms of Reference of the Postal CEOs Forum and the Postal Regulators Forum;

Noting the inclusive approach advocated by the Policy and Regulation Committee in order to give all five (05) regions the opportunity to be represented in the offices of the postal regulators' forums and postal executives;

Further noting the introduction of the concept of "Co-Chairs";

Having examined the recommendation of the Policy and Regulation Committee to change the Bureau membership of the Postal Regulators Forum;

HEREBY DECIDES AS FOLLOWS:

The Bureau of the African Postal Regulators Forum shall be composed of:

- Co-Chairs: Central Africa and North Africa
- Rapporteurs: West, East and Southern Africa;
- Secretary: PAPU General Secretariat.

The General Secretariat to implement this Resolution.

On the establishment of Postal Sector Regulatory Authorities

The Administrative Council of the Pan African Postal Union (PAPU), meeting during its 42nd Ordinary Session from 11th to 12th June 2024 in Arusha, United Republic of Tanzania;

Mindful of the PAPU Convention;

Further mindful of the Detailed Regulations of the PAPU Convention;

Having regard to the Rules of Procedure of the Administrative Council;

Having noted that the Postal Sector has been opened up in the majority of PAPU Member States;

Considering the pivotal role of regulatory authorities in combatting unfair competition, improving quality of service and fostering competition in the postal arena;

Cognizant of the recommendation tabled by the Policy and Regulation Committee;

HEREBY RECOMMENDS AS FOLLOWS:

That Member States which have not yet done so should establish a regulatory authority for postal services;

INSTRUCTS:

The General Secretariat to implement this Recommendation.

Article 6, point 1 of Detailed Regulations of the Convention: Vacant seat on the Council

A seat of the Council shall be considered vacant when a Member State is not represented at two consecutive sessions of the Council or when it resigns from the Council or denounces its membership of the Union.

The definition of a vacancy seems incomplete. It needs to be improved on to adequately cover various situations that may cause vacancies to arise.

Article 6, point 1 of Detailed Regulations of the Convention: Vacant seat on the Council

A seat in the Council shall be considered vacant in any of the following instances:

- Where a Member State is not represented during two consecutive sessions of the Council;
- Where a Member State resigns from the Council or the Union; or
- Upon expiry of the term of office of a Member State in the Council.

Article 6, point 2 of Detailed Regulations of the Convention: Vacant seat on the Council

When a seat on the Council becomes vacant, the affected region shall designate another Member State to serve on the Council for its remaining term of office.

This provision is deficient in that it does not sufficiently define the procedure for replacing the Member State whose seat on the Council becomes vacant. It would seem that the mere designation of the State by the region concerned is sufficient to give that State a seat on the Council. However, it is clear from the functions of the Conference that it elects the members of Council (Article 2, paragraph 10 of the Detailed Regulations). It is therefore only logical to harmonize this provision with Article 2(10) of the Detailed Regulations.

Article 6, point 2: Vacant seat on the Council

When a seat on the Council becomes vacant between two sessions of the Conference, the affected region shall designate another Member State to serve on the Council for its remaining term of office. The designated member State presented to the Secretary General to serve on the Council for the remaining term of office shall be assessed for compliance with membership requirements by the Administrative Council, whereupon the latter who shall then refer the matter, as the case may be, to the Conference Bureau for a decision.

Article 11 of Detailed regulations of the convention: Emergency consultation

Between two sessions of the Council. the Secretary-General may, subject to guidance from the Chairperson of the Administrative Council, consult Member States of the Council about one or several urgent problems for decision. In such a case, the decisions shall be taken by simple majority on the basis of replies which Member-States shall communicate to the Secretary General by the speediest and most efficient means. Such consultation shall not to decisions with financial relate implications exceeding the budget ceiling for the current financial year. Any decision taken through this method shall be in accordance with the Convention and its Detailed Regulations, and tabled formally at the next meeting of the Council.

The issue of decision-making between two (02) sessions of the Conference of Plenipotentiaries was referred to the Legal Experts Team during its meetings on 27 July and 14 August 2023.

The opinion of the legal experts was to retain the provision as drafted on the grounds that it was sufficiently clear. However, in support of this provision, an emergency consultation procedure on matters falling within the competence of the Conference should be envisaged between two (02) sessions of the Conference.

Article 11: Emergency consultation

11.1. Between two sessions of the Council, the Secretary-General may, subject to guidance from the Chairperson of the Administrative Council, consult Member States of the Council about one or several urgent problems for decision. In such a case, the decisions shall be taken by simple majority on the basis of replies which Member-States shall communicate to the Secretary General by the speediest and most efficient means. Such consultation shall not relate to decisions with financial implications exceeding the budget ceiling for the current financial year. Any decision taken through this method shall be in accordance with the Convention and its Detailed Regulations, and tabled formally at the next meeting of the Council.

11.2 (New): Between two sessions of the Conference, the Secretary General may, subject to guidance from the Chairperson of the Administrative Council, consult Member States of the Conference Bureau about one or several urgent matters for decision. Any decision taken through this method shall be in accordance with the Convention and its Detailed Regulations and tabled formally to the Conference during its next Ordinary Session.

RULES OF PROCEDURE OF PLENIPOTENTIARY CONFERENCE

Rules of Procedure of the Plenipotentiary Conference

Article 5 (bis) (New) of Rules of Procedure of the Plenipotentiary Conference: Emergency consultation of the Plenipotentiary Conference Bureau

- Conference for decision-making, the Chairperson of the Conference, after consulting the Bureau members, shall decide on the method and means of consultation. Insofar as possible, consultation shall take place by the most effective methods and means in light of the nature and urgency of the matter referred for consultation.
- 2. The Conference Bureau's decision shall be signed by the Chairperson and reported to the Plenipotentiary Conference during its next session.

1. Introduction

1.1. By letter No. PAPU/GS/AF/H/INTM/042 dated 7 November 2022, the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Committee referred the matter to the Policy and Regulatory Committee with a view to having the Working Group on Policy and Legal Harmonisation consider the "Implications of overlapping contract periods between outgoing and incoming elected officials in order to facilitate the handover process [...]"

- 1.2. Previously, the handover/takeover between incoming and outgoing elected officials at PAPU used to take place on a single day, i.e. on the date set by the Plenipotentiary Conference for assumption of duty by newly elected officials. However, due to the logistical challenges of achieving this feat on a single day, it has been observed that the single day is not adequate as it does not allow sufficient time for incoming officials to fully familiarize themselves with all matters/working files of the General Secretariat handed over to them.
- 1.3. During the Human Resources Management Working Group held a virtual on 28th June 2022, where-in this matter was deliberated under Doc No.03 ref: PAPU/ATC/FAC/HRM/01/2022. Deliberations resulted in a advice for consideration of the handover/takeover procedure to be developed so that it accommodates the need to allow adequate time for the handover, to the incoming elected officials, of the Union's bank balances, assets (movable and immovable), liabilities, staff issues, Departments reports, issues, challenges and opportunities, agreements, files and records, and responsibilities.

2. Recommendation

- **2.1.** Arrival at the General Secretariat of the Union at most two weeks before the actual date of assumption of duty set by the Plenipotentiary Conference;
- **2.2.** The Union shall cater for the accommodation, feeding and local transportation expenses of incoming officials prior to the date of assumption of duty;
- **2.3.** The handing over notes shall be jointly verified and signed by both the outgoing and incoming officials and shall be witnessed by the Chairperson of the Plenipotentiary Conference and the Host Country Minister in charge of postal services.
- **2.4.** Consider and adopt the draft decision that will be eventually escalated to the 11th Ordinary Plenipotentiary Conference of the Union.

HANDOVER/TAKEOVER PROCEDURES BETWEEN INCOMING AND OUTGOING ELECTED OFFICIALS

PART I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1: Definitions

- **1.1.** "Outgoing elected officials": The incumbent Secretary General and Assistant Secretary General in office at the PAPU General Secretariat whose tenure is coming to an end and are due to vacate office;
- **1.2.** "Incoming elected officials": The Secretary General and Assistant Secretary General newly elected to take over from the outgoing elected officials;
- **1.3.** "Secretary General": The Secretary General of the Pan African Postal Union;
- **1.4. "Assistant Secretary General":** The Assistant Secretary General of the Pan African Postal Union.
- **1.5.** "Union"; The Pan African Postal Union.
- **1.6. "Chairperson"**; The Minister in charge of postal services elected by the Plenipotentiary Conference to serve as its Chairperson during the session that elected the incoming Secretary General and the Assistant Secretary General;
- **1.7. "Host Minister"** The Minister in charge of postal services of the United Republic of Tanzania where the handover/takeover ceremony is being hosted.

Article 2: Subject

This document lays down the handover/takeover procedures between incoming and outgoing elected officials.

Article 3: Objectives

This procedure is primarily introduced to ensure continuity of service following the election of new officials.

Accordingly, it is specifically aimed at:

- Facilitating a smooth takeover of their portfolio and responsibilities and matters by the incoming Elected Officials;
- Dealing with the implications inherent in overlapping service times between outgoing and incoming elected officials.

PART II

FORMALITIES PRIOR TO HANDOVER/TAKEOVER

Article 4: Travel of Incoming Elected Officials

The General Secretariat assists incoming elected officials in organizing their travel and that of their dependent relatives to PAPU Headquarters in Arusha, United Republic of Tanzania. They are facilitated for visa applications (where applicable), are provided with flight tickets, relevant information and documents required for the trip and their relocation to Arusha.

Article 5: Arrival date of incoming Elected Officials

Incoming elected officials shall travel to PAPU Headquarters two (2) weeks ahead of the scheduled date of the official handover/takeover ceremony.

<u>Article 6:</u> Pre-takeover responsibility for incoming Elected Officials

- **6.1.** Notwithstanding the rights and benefits recognized by the Plenipotentiary Conference, during the **two (2)** week period prior to their formal takeover from the outgoing elected officials, the Union shall defray the accommodation and living expenses of incoming Elected Officials.
- **6.2.** Additionally, the Union shall provide them with transport between their hotel and PAPU Headquarters throughout the transition period.

PART III

HANDOVER/TAKEOVER

<u>Article 7:</u> Handover/Takeover Arrangements

- **7.1.** During the two (2) weeks period leading up to the official handover ceremony, a series of briefings shall be organized, under the auspices of the outgoing elected officials, in order to transfer documents, present the organization and functioning of the Union as well as the human, material and financial resources available at the General Secretariat.
- **7.2**. In this regard, the following activities shall be undertaken during the transition period:
- **7.2.1.** Briefing by each Head of Department on Performance, Status of the Department to include projects completed, ongoing projects, future prospects and Challenges.
- **7.2.2.** Presentation of activities undertaken during the tenure of the outgoing Elected Officials and the status of implementation of quadrennial programmes and the newly approved programmes including strategies for their implementation.
- **7.2.3.** Physical verification of working files, assets (movable and immovable) and liabilities of the Union:
- **7.2.4.** Provision of statement of bank balances and reconciliations statements for all listed accounts of the Union;
- **7.2.5.** Change of signatories to the Union's bank accounts.
- **7.2.6.** Meeting with all the Staff of the General Secretariat;
- **7.2.7.** Meeting with Key Stakeholders in the host community i.e. Bank Officials, Regional Administrative Secretary, Regional Police Commander, Regional Commissioner, City Mayor, City Director, etc
- **7.2.8.** Handing over of vehicle, office and residential houses keys, as well as the furniture at those places
- **7.2.9.** changing of security passwords for computers and Laptops;
- **7.3.0.** Handover/Takeover Ceremony in the presence of the Chairperson of the Plenipotentiary Conference, Host country Minister and other invited dignitaries preceded by a tour of the PAPU Tower and its surrounding premises;

Article 8: Handover/Takeover Process

- **8.1.** The official handover/takeover ceremony shall be held on the date set by the Plenipotentiary Conference at the time of electing the incoming elected officials.
- **8.2.** It shall be presided over by the Chairperson of the Plenipotentiary Conference or his/her representative.
- **8.3.** The handover/takeover shall be conducted between the incoming and outgoing Secretaries General in the presence of the incoming and outgoing Assistant Secretaries General.
- **8.4.** The Handover/Takeover form shall be signed in triplicate (03) originals in French and English languages, with one (01) copy handed to each elected official and the last copy to be archived at the PAPU General Secretariat.

Article 9: Implications of the Handover/Takeover

- **9.1.** The signing of the handover/takeover instrument shall officially sanction the cessation of service for outgoing elected officials and the commencement of service for incoming elected officials.
- **9.2.** Accordingly, all the rights and duties of outgoing elected officials shall be passed on to the incoming Elected Officials.

Article 10: Adoption of procedure

This procedure is adopted by Plenipotentiary Conference Resolution No. and may be amended by this selfsame organ as and when deemed necessary

In this regard, the General Secretariat sent a letter to Member States and Restricted Unions on 8th February 2023 requesting their models and related documents. In view of the fact that only few documents had been received, the Policy and Regulation Committee decided, prior to the 41st Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council held from 29 to 30 August 2023, to instruct the General Secretariat to issue a reminder to Member States and Restricted Unions.

Accordingly, a circular letter was re-sent to them in this regard.

Additionally, the Secretariat General administered a questionnaire on postal regulation in Africa to make up for the lack of response or complement the documents or information provided by the Member States.

I. INTRODUCTION

Further to Resolution No. **18/PAPU/AC/XXXVI/2017** passed at the 36th Ordinary Session of the Administrative Council held from **8**th **to 10**th **May 2017**, in Nairobi, Kenya, the PAPU General Secretariat has been organizing the African Postal Regulators' Forum on an annual basis. This document is presented in compliance with the need to have the theme of the 2024 edition of the Postal Regulators Forum approved by the said Working Group in pursuit of the Work Plan for the Working Group on Regulation Development.

II. PROPOSED THEMES AND SUB-THEMES

The theme proposed for the 2024 edition of the Postal Regulators Forum deals with Financial Inclusion which is defined as the process of giving people excluded from the formal financial system access to financial services at affordable costs.

Financial Inclusion is a major concern at the national, continental and global levels. Indeed, several countries have adopted strategies to promote Financial Inclusion.

On the African front, the African Union made recommendations to enhance Financial Inclusion on the continent in pursuit of its Agenda 2063 vision. On the global front, the United Nations recognizes Financial Inclusion as a key factor in achieving the seventeen (17) Sustainable Development Goals.

However, despite the efforts made by financial institutions, the overall percentage of people with access to banking services has remained unsatisfactory for a variety of reasons, including low outreach, poverty, high transaction costs and mistrust. According to the Global Findex 2021 Database, 76% of adults worldwide had a bank account versus 55% in sub-Saharan Africa, including 33% with a mobile money account.

Against this backdrop, postal services play a vital role in promoting the Financial Inclusion for their citizenry by leveraging their extensive network and diversified financial products and services. Moreover, the postal sector is second only to banks in terms of Financial Inclusion globally.

Postal operators therefore offer genuine alternatives to the formal banking services when it comes to Financial Inclusion. However, they face a myriad of challenges, not least of which is the ineffective or non-existent regulatory framework. Indeed, while the postal regulatory framework sets out the conditions for Posts to offer certain services or serve as a post bank, there is some uncertainty as to the nature of postal financial services, which fall midway between the postal and banking regulatory ecosystems.

It is worth recognizing that postal financial services overlap into the conventional financial or banking sector, hence the presence of other entities involved in regulating the banking sector. These include Ministries of Finance, Central Banks and Competition Authorities. To take full advantage of the opportunities offered by the Post in promoting Financial Inclusion, the roles of the various players, in particular the postal regulator, need to be clearly defined, so as to create a synergistic momentum with the other players driving the Financial Inclusion agenda.

1. The theme: "Leveraging postal regulation to advance postal Financial Inclusion"

The General Secretariat is proposing the following theme for the 2024 edition of the African Postal Regulators Forum: "Leveraging Postal Regulation to Advance Postal Financial Inclusion".

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The prime objective of this theme is to enable African postal regulators to share views on the role and place of postal regulation in fostering Financial Inclusion.

More specifically, the 2024 edition of the African Postal Regulators Forum will offer a platform for participants to unpack various aspects of Financial Inclusion, including:

- The current state of regulation of postal financial services;
- Prospects for promoting Financial Inclusion via the Post;
- Key success factors for postal Financial Inclusion.

In this respect, **two (02) Panel Discussions** will be organized during this edition of the event, namely:

- **❖ Sub-Theme 1:** Current state and prospects for promoting Postal Financial Inclusion;
- ❖ Sub-Theme 2: Key success factors for postal Financial Inclusion.

2. Proposed panelists and moderators

In order to explore these sub-themes, there are three (03) proposed panelists per panel. Panelists may be identified from the following countries: Cameroon, Burkina Faso, Democratic Republic of Congo, Benin, Republic of Côte d'Ivoire, Algeria, Kenya, United Republic of Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, Eswatini and Madagascar. Moderators may also be chosen from the above countries.

I. INTRODUCTION

The first ever African Postal Regulators' Conference, held in Dakar, Senegal, from 23 to 24 June 2023, enabled participants to discuss important postal regulatory issues and come up with relevant recommendations. This inaugural event garnered great enthusiasm among PAPU Member States.

In view of the satisfactory results of the maiden edition of the said conference, the Administrative Council, meeting in its 41st Ordinary Session from 29 to 30 August 2023 in Arusha, United Republic of Tanzania, adopted Resolution no.06/PAPU/AC/XLI/2023 establishing the Conference of African Postal Regulators.

Pursuant to this Resolution, the General Secretariat is responsible for organizing the African Postal Regulators Conference. This document is a contribution to the organization of the second edition of this event, to be held in Arusha, Tanzania, on a date to be determined.

II. PROPOSED THEME AND SUB-THEMES

The core theme for this year's event is/ "Emerging postal industry and regulation trends in the digital age."

The choice of this theme is motivated by the new operating environment in which the postal sector finds itself, shaped by the opening up to the private sector and ever growing demands from postal service consumers. As a result, digital transformation is an imperative if we are to remain competitive in today's highly competitive market. Digital transformation necessarily calls for adoption of ICTs, which provide postal operators with opportunities to develop innovative and carefully-tailored services. In this respect, operators must be in a position to fully seize the opportunities offered by new technologies such as 5G, artificial intelligence, Fintech, the Internet of Things, blockchain, etc. All of which should help the Post to enhance operational efficiency and offer quality services to customers.

However, the use of digital tools not only offers opportunities, it also presents major challenges such as setting up infrastructures, training, cybersecurity, personal data protection, etc. These issues are primarily of concern to operators, but it is up to regulators and ministries in charge of postal services to deploy the appropriate regulatory instruments to resolve them. They must therefore be ready to tackle these challenges by constantly exploring innovative solutions, hence the overriding need for innovative and appropriate postal regulation.

The core theme of the Conference will be unpacked through discussions on the following subthemes:

- Digitalizing traditional services for operators to facilitate access to products and create value-added services for customers;
- Technical and legal challenges facing postal services digitalization;
- Postal regulation techniques and methods for efficient postal services digitalization;
- Capacity-building in new lines of expertise.
